The Woody Guthrie and Bob Dylan Centers Creative Writing Workshop will take place on Friday and Saturday, July 11th & 12th, from 3-5 PM at St. Paul's United Methodist Church. "Recording Woody's Legacy," an interactive recording session where

participants will have the opportunity to record and perform "This Land is Your Land" will be hosted by R.T. Valine with support from TASCAM on Friday, July 11th, at 2:30 PM at Benson Media Center. On Saturday, July 12th, at 11 AM, Benson Media Center will also host Harmonica Lessons, followed by Native American Storytelling and Flute Building with Nelson Harjo, one of the last traditional flute-makers of the Muscogee Nation of Oklahoma at 2 PM.

"We invite families to join us in Okemah for a weekend filled with creativity, community, and a celebration of Woody's enduring legacy."
